General Rules & Requirements

1 - Our Show will follow The ILR (International Lama Registry) rules as found here - ILR-SD Guidelines

In addition to the above we will abide by the following:

- 2 Animal Requirements for Llamas and Alpacas
 - a. Llamas and alpacas must be in the possession of the exhibitor and under ownership by the exhibitor, exhibitor's parents or in the partnership (lease) by May 1st of the current year.
 - b. Llamas and alpacas may be registered or unregistered stock.
 - c. 4-H and FFA llama and alpaca registered and unregistered stock will show in the same class.
- 3 Designated animals: The exhibitor must use their own (or leased) animal in all the classes. The minimum age should be 6 months of age for both llamas and alpacas.
- 4 Show Order: Show order is as follows: Obstacle, PR (Public Relations), Showmanship, and Costume. All classes will start with the Senior Division while Intermediate and Junior Divisions will follow respectively. We will work around any conflicts for any and all 4H and FFA members.
- 5 Obstacle Course: Exhibitors in the Obstacle Courses will be required to navigate their animals through a minimum of six obstacles including but not limited to jumps, maneuverability (cones or inner tube), a change of pace, backing, a bridge and ramp, and obstructed entrance. The animal will be required to be shown in a clean, well fitting halter and lead. The level of difficulty of the obstacles will increase as the age of the exhibitor group increases.
- 6 Public Relation (PR) Class: This class is for the llama or alpaca that participates in community activities, going to school, hospitals, service clubs, parades, charity functions or other events. The animal will be expected to show in a clean, well fitting halter and lead. The course may include (but not limited to) stairs or ramps, petting by volunteers, loading into a trailer, backing, showing teeth and picking up a foot. This class will be scored according to the International Llama Registry Show Division. This class will have a minimum of six obstacles and the level of difficulty will increase as the age of the exhibitor group increases.

- 7 Costume Class: The animal and handler must be in costume and with a unifying theme. Participants may include a short paragraph to be read by the show announcer describing the costume.
- 8 In all classes voice and hand commands are allowed and are expected. However training aids and food or treats will NOT be allowed.
- 9 Show Attire: All Showmanship exhibitors must wear black, dark blue, or khaki pants with a collared shirt (polo or button down) and appropriate footwear. Open-toed shoes or sandals are not appropriate footwear. All classes except the Costume class require the above attire.
- 10 Premier Exhibitor: Premier Exhibitor will be decided by totaling points from the following: Skillathon (with judges interview), Showmanship placing, Obstacle & PR class placings and general livestock judging placing. It will not include costume placing. Points are as follows: 1st place = 100 pts, 2nd place = 75 pts, 3rd place = 50 pts, 4th place = 25 pts and 5th place = 15 pts.
